

Conducting Chart Stimulated Recall (CSR)

Description

Chart Stimulated Recall (CSR) is a useful technique to use with learners who have considerable clinical independence. The main benefit is that it can help you assess your learners' thinking process and clinical reasoning.

This is a workshop for clinical supervisors to be equipped with this workplace-based assessment technique, and experience using authentic patient cases-notes entries to open a discussion with supervisee. Participants will explore about designing structured probing questions to reveal reasoning thoughts leading to decision making and their implications.

Duration

0.5 day

Target Audience

Healthcare professionals, including doctors, nurses, allied health professionals and pharmacists

Programme Content

This programme comprises the following learning topics:

1. How does Chart Stimulated Recall (CSR) work
2. What can you do with CSR
3. Does CSR work
4. What makes CSR reliable

Learning Outcomes

At the end of the programme, participants will be able to:

1. Understand about Chart Stimulated Recall, and what it can or cannot do (e.g. in clinical reasoning)
2. Describe the pros and cons of Chart Stimulated Recall
3. Structure open-ended questions for the situation to be assessed

Methodology

This programme is designed to be an interactive learning experience for participants. Methodologies used will include small group exercises on structuring questions to ask, and developing forms based on your context.
