Description

The Tech Tools Series Workshop introduces various technology tools and how they can be used to facilitate teaching and learning, through various approaches of online learning, such as remote, self-directed, or blended.

This workshop seeks to equip and expand participants' capabilities and skills to use and leverage appropriate technology tools and apps to enhance existing teaching and learning materials and developing engaging content for online settings. Participants will also explore the use of technology tools and apps to facilitate collaborative learning among their learners.

The workshop will provide ample opportunities for hands-on practice through experiencing the use of several technology tools and apps.

Duration

Total of 8 hours, comprising 2 x 4-hour sessions

- 2. Mobile learning in context
- 3. Micro-learning courseware development
- 4. Demonstration and hands-on practice of the tech tools, which may include:

 - Kahoot
 - Adobe Express
 - Google Classroom
 - Google Drive
 - Zoom

Target Audience

For clinical teachers and educators who are keen to utilize technology tools and apps in course development and in instructional teaching.

The workshop is also applicable to administrators and operational staff who are developing interactive and engaging content and publicity materials for events.

- 1. Use a range of technology tools and apps to enhance and facilitate online teaching and learning;
- 2. Explore the diversification of learning delivery on digital platforms;
- 3. Develop engaging learning content for online settings using technology tools and apps; and
- 4. Facilitate collaborative learning using technology tools and apps

Methodologies used will include

- 1. Pre-programme self-directed learning
- 2. Classroom and online training
- 3. Group discussions
- 4. Hands-on practical sessions

All participants of the workshop are requested to have an existing project for application of learning. This may include a lesson plan, case study, topic or event.
