Trauma care is never a solo effort. It is a team effort that involves a wide range of pre-hospital, medical, nursing and allied health care providers. Most trauma patients will also need the involvement of their families and community groups to aid them in their journey to recovery.

In multi-system trauma, there are many emergent and urgent interventions that are required to save the life of the patient. To add to this challenge, there is the concept of the “*Golden Hour*” where by all these interventions need to be instituted, to give the patient the best recovery chance. What can be done if there are multiple trauma victims or in a mass casualty situation? With many competing interventions, the pressure of time, the co-ordination of all the involved personnel, how do we make sense of the “chaos” to save patients?

Trauma care is complex but rewarding. What are the key considerations and how do we manage this “chaos”?
