Key Facts and Figures

- 7.66 hectares of land space (about 11 football fields)
- Up to 1,800 beds (to be developed in phases)
- Operations to progressively commence from 2022
- Walking distance to underground Woodlands South MRT station (projected to open in 2019)

An Integrated Acute and Community Hospital

- Fully integrated acute and community hospital.
- To facilitate the transfer of critically ill patients, the Emergency Department is connected by trauma lifts to the podium which sites the diagnostic facilities, Operating Theatres (OT) and Intensive Care Unit (ICU).
- Acute and community hospital wards are located in the same building as the podium and are designed to enable the seamless transfer of care.



Specialist Outpatient Clinics (SOCs)

- The SOCs are located in a dedicated SOC block connected by a bridge to the podium.
- The SOC is supported by Satellite Radiology, Outpatient Rehabilitation and Outpatient Pharmacy.
- Patients with co-morbidity will be able to consult a range of specialists, nurses and therapists within a single clinic visit.

Long-Term Care (LTC)

- Cluster-living environment to promote dignity and maximise independence.
- Dementia friendly facility features living room space within for family members to spend quality time with the LTC residents.
- Co-located with an Inter-generational garden to enable meaningful programs for the seniors and the youth.

Community Spaces

- Woodlands Health Campus is designed as an open and inviting campus for the community.
- Patients, staff and visitors will be able to enjoy the wide array of open spaces and greenery on its ground level, which is car-free.







Healing Forest Garden

- Designed by the National Parks Board (NParks)
- Segmented into four zones according to the visitor's behaviour and level of engagement in his or her natural environment
- Encourages mental, emotional and physical restoration for patients at WHC
- The first two zones are designed to provide a serene environment for meditation and leisure walking
- The other two zones are designed to facilitate social interactions through activity lawns, community gardens and play areas

Therapeutic Gardens

- Designed in consultation with NParks
- Located within the campus to support the various therapeutic needs of the patient
- In consultation with NParks, specially chosen plants and careful landscaping within the therapeutic gardens will provide a restorative environment for patients during rehabilitation programs
